A reflection concerning abortion

The pro-life charity Life alerted me to the British Pregnancy Advisory Service (BPAS) 2012-13 annual report: they generated £24.6 million specifically from: 'termination of pregnancy advice treatment and care', which cost them £22.5 million. As a result they are able to record that: 'The charity's financial health is sound'. A very high proportion of this work is for the NHS and includes the pre-abortion 'counselling'. Their strategy for 2014-15 is to increase the proportion of abortions in the UK that BPAS provides. This means that a large proportion of the pre-abortion 'counselling' is provided by those whose vested interest is to perform abortions.
